Llamas may start arriving on Friday, May 9, 2008. Please enter the park by Gate #4. Llamas must be in place by 10:00 P.M. Friday. This Llama Show is an ALSA approved show sponsored by the Arkansas Llama Association and SCLA. Exhibitors are not required to be members of ALSA. Non-ALSA member fee is \$30.00 per ranch for adults. The youth non-ALSA member fee is \$15.00 per ranch.

ENTRIES: Show entries must be made on the official entry form. Entry forms may be copied. Entry form and Premium Book may be downloaded from the website: www.laarkllama.com or a printed copy can be sent via U.S. mail.

Entry Deadlines: May 1, 2008

Entry forms must be postmarked by May 1st or add \$10.00 per class late fee.
NO Llamas will be accepted for entry after May 5, 2008.

Entries in Produce of Dam and Get of Sire must have names of offspring on entry form.

STALL FEES: \$30.00 per stall. Please indicate at place provided the number of animal stalls required. There is a maximum of two (2) llamas per stall. If you wish to stall next to a specific exhibitor, please indicate preference on the entry form. Due to insurance regulations, flammable materials such as straw, shredded paper, etc. are NOT allowed to be used anywhere in stalls. Hay may NOT be used as bedding. Hay and feed will not be available. Please bring what you need to provide for your llamas.

DIRECTIONS: Enter Kay Rodgers Park at Gate #4 (N.50th St.). Stall assignments and show packets will be available at check-in in the Jr. Auction Sale Barn. Llamas will be stalled in barn adjacent to the Hardin Show Arena.

PARKING AND CAMPING: There is parking within the fairgrounds. Campsites are available, including electricity, at \$20.00 per campsite. Please mark your registration form if you wish to reserve a campsite. Camping at Gate #4A.

REGISTRY: Llamas 5 months and older must be registered with ILR, except non-breeders and llamas used only in youth classes. Exhibitors must send a copy of ILR registration with entry form.

REQUIREMENTS: All animals must have a Health Certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian within 30 days if from out-of-state. In-state health certification must be within 90 days. Brucellosis and TB are NOT required. Health papers and ILR registration (or copy) must be presented at check-in. Stall assignments and show packets will be provided at check-in.

YOUTH PERFORMANCE EVENTS: All youth between the ages 8 and 18 (as of last birthday) may show in ALSA approved youth classes. To qualify for Youth ALSA Points the youth must be an ALSA member. Points go to the youth, not the llama. You do not have to be an ALSA member to show in these classes. The same animal may not be entered in two divisions. Youth may also show in open classes but ALSA points in these classes will go to the llama. Llamas may be shown by more than one youth in youth classes.

AGE: The date for determining a llama's age is May 10, 2008.

HANDLER: Since this is a hobo show, casual attire, costumes, hobo-type clothing are acceptable. Appropriate shoes must be worn. Open toed shoes, sandals and bare feet will disqualify the exhibitor.

Classes may be combined at judge's discretion

Suri - Wool with a natural luster that hangs and drapes over the llamas body, usually forming a natural part along the spine, fibers grouped into a very distinctive and well defined lock structure.

Light Wool - Minimum body wool, short neck wool, smooth legs.

Medium Wool - Moderate to long body wool, minimal to moderate neck wool, smooth to moderate leg wool.

Heavy Wool - Abundant body and neck wool with moderate to abundant leg wool.
